### About the Program

Brewongle EEC is committed to delivering high quality education that promotes, respects and values Aboriginal culture and custodianship of Country. Our educators recognise the strength, diversity, ownership and richness of culture in improving wellbeing and educational outcomes for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students. As such we offer a Cultural Leadership Program for Year 9 to Year 11 students, supported by the local NSW AECG - Da Murrytoola.

This program endeavours to support students in developing leadership skills, pursuing a love of lifelong learning and increasing participation and retention of Aboriginal students in schools. Warrawi Yana Nura affords students the opportunity to stand tall and take pride in their cultural heritage through various workshops and excursions, regaining lost culture and building a strong sense of identity which is integral in helping Aboriginal students overcome educational and life challenges.

### Aims

Warrawi Yana Nura aims to provide a *transformative moment* to middle years/senior Aboriginal students and take them beyond the classroom to engage in purposeful and authentic learnscapes to;

- Build and apply cultural knowledge
- Advance leadership skills
- Engage with schooling

## Program Goals

### Build and apply cultural knowledge

- In collaboration with our Aboriginal Education Team, consisting of Aboriginal community members, students will participate in a series of cultural workshops to: build a sense of place; learn the histories and cultures of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders; develop a sense of identity and to know that identity is strength; and to develop and maintain a special connection to and responsibility for Country/Place.
- Visit Devil's Rock Sacred Site at Maroota under the guidance of Darug Knowledge Keeper – Erin Wilkins
- Develop a protocol to practice traditional ways of doing. Students will learn about ceremony and traditional sustainable use of natural resources applied in the use of some traditional skills.
- Students will learn about the differences between women's, mens's and family business including dance.
- Work directly with staff from with Link-Up NSW to trace the family connections of those students who are currently unaware of their Country/Nation. Working towards creating a map for each school identifying the Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander nations of Aboriginal students.

### Advance Leadership Skills

- A distinct workshop examining leadership skills and attributes and conflict resolution.
- Link students with community mentors.
- Encouragement and help with development of Junior AECG at participating schools.
- Deliver a workshop and/or cultural leadership activity to teach to primary school students as part of Brewongle EEC's internal programs or with Murama Indigenous Youth Summit in October 2019 hosted at Sydney Olympic Park.

### Engage with schooling

- Develop a personal Acknowledgement and/or Welcome to Country under the guidance of local Darug Elders and Knowledge Keepers. Deliver using some language to their school/community where appropriate and/or develop in language an Acknowledgement of Country.
- Apply leadership and cultural knowledge to understand **Reconciliation Action Plans** and the possibilities of developing one in each student's school utilising the process available via Reconciliation Australia.
- Enhance **literacy skills** utilising iPads to develop a Digital Learning Diary documenting their learning journey throughout the Warrawi Yana Nura Project.

### **Criteria Selection of Students**

Students applying for this program should be;

- ✓ Interested in their own Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander histories and cultures
- ✓ Committed and self- motivated
- ✓ Inspired to reach goals
- ✓ Willing to be a positive team member
- ✓ A lifelong learner
